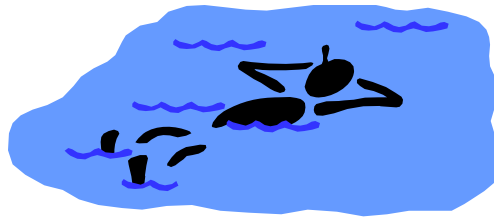

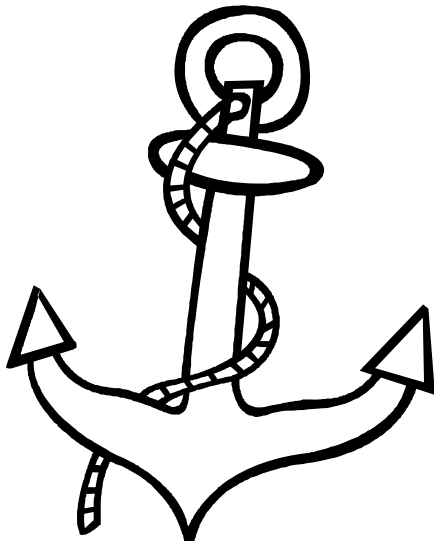

Rail Bar included with ticket purchase.

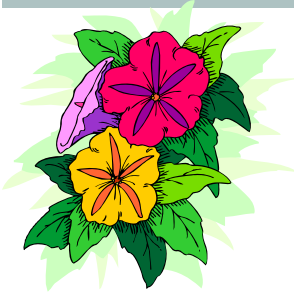
Music will be provided by a DJ.

EYC Business Notes

1—The July GMM produced some changes to the annual dues for regular and social members. Regular member dues increased from \$250 up to \$375 per year and social member dues increased from \$75 up to \$175 per year. The slip rates were increased at the July GMM; member rates went from \$18 up to \$20 per foot and non-member rates went from \$27 up to \$30 per foot. The rates for transient docking will be increased next year from \$20 per night up to \$1 per foot per night.

2—The Slip Agreement that all slip-holders sign requires that all vessels be “**sea-worthy and presentable**”. Boat inspections must be completed in order to keep or bid on a slip. If you haven’t taken the time to address these requirements please do so **now**. If you have any problems or questions, please contact any of your officers immediately as time is running out!

3 — Slip night is after the GMM on September 12th. You must be a member in good standing, all bills paid, slip fee paid and a current copy of insurance provided before slip night. You must be present to bid on a slip or provide **written** proxy to someone to bid for you. All additional slip fees incurred on slip night by slip changes **MUST** be paid that evening or the changes will not take effect!

4 — Participation in club affairs, events, committees, maintenance, and operations is an obligation that should be shared by **all**. This is a club that requires members to be “participating” in order for us to be successful and thrive. Please consider getting involved so that together we can achieve these goals.

5 — Secretary Dave Tolerico has assumed the duties associated with Membership. Dave will be scheduling the interviews and processing new applications. He will also be contact for parking permits.

Second Friday of October, Annual General Membership Meeting, Election of Officers

The Nominating Committee presents the slate of officers at the August GMM meeting. Flag Officers are nominated by automatic stepping-up to the next higher rank. Occasionally if an officer is not advancing, the nominating committee will submit someone else for this position. Members not in favor of the slate of officers may nominate someone else by a petition, signed by 25% of EYC members in good standing. Petitions must be filed with the secretary by the September GMM.

In October the Officers are usually elected with a simple motion that is seconded and followed by a verbal yea or show of hands to accept the slate of Officers as presented. A secret ballot would have to be conducted if a valid petition was filed with the Secretary.

The current Commodore releases his/her Officers and committees following the election. He/she then issues the "Oath of Office" to the newly elected Commodore and passes him/her the gavel to take control of the meeting. The new Commodore then installs his/her Bridge of Officers.

Also at the Annual October meeting -

- Two Members-at-Large shall be elected to serve three years on the Board of Governors
- The Chairman of the Finance Committee is elected to serve one year.
- Two members are elected to serve for one year on the Nominating Committee.
- Additional members shall be elected to serve three years on the House Committee. The BOG will establish the length of terms for each position so that a rolling 3 years will be established for succeeding terms to avoid all terms expiring at the same time.

Positions are available on several EYC committee, finance, membership, house etc. Serving on a committee is an excellent way to make a difference in your club.



